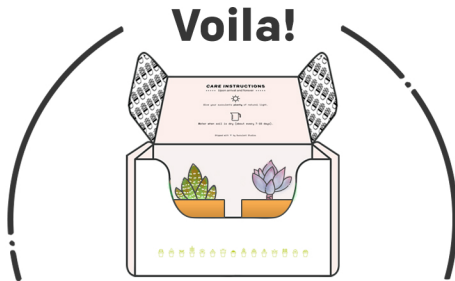

SUCCULENT PARENTS

Keep this guide handy for future boxes

UNBOXING

1. With the box in front of you, open its lid, then pull the cardboard insert toward you and up out of the box.
2. Gently pull the succulents from their box.
3. Remove all rubber bands, wood wool, and any other materials that are securing your succulent and its pot.



Your succulents will be happy and healthy in their pots for up to a few weeks, at which point their biodegradable pots will begin to soften. At that point, just place your succulent --pot and all--into a container of your choice, and surround with soil.

POTTING

1. You can pot your succulents as soon as they arrive, or up to a few weeks after.
2. Use any brand of cactus soil when potting your succulents.
3. Choose a pot with a drainage hole that is 1-2" larger than the biodegradable pot your succulent comes in so you can nestle the entire pot right into the new container.
4. Place your succulent with its pot into the new container, and surround with soil.
5. If your succulent hasn't been watered in a while, now's the time! If it's been watered recently, wait a week or two before watering again.
6. After a few months, the original pot will have completely degraded.

LEAF DROP

What it is:

Leaves sometimes fall from your succulent when jostled during shipment.

How to fix it:

Your succulent will grow new leaves and continue to thrive. In the meantime, you can propagate the fallen ones! Lay them on top of a tray of soil, and set somewhere they'll get partial sunlight. Allow to dry for three days, then spritz with water every other day. After 3-5 weeks, new roots and rosettes will sprout from the leaves!

STEM SNAP

What it is:

Your succulent has fallen from its pot and snapped off from its roots.

How to fix it:

Set the succulent out for three days so the snapped-off part of the stem can callus over. Nestle it back in its soil and water lightly once a week for about 3-5 weeks. During this time, new roots will grow!
